

## *Daly's Art On Exhibit At Museum*

Bold sculptures in iron, wood and marble highlight an exhibition of work of Cornell University professor Norman Daly which opens today at the Andrew Dickson White Museum of Art on the Cornell campus.

Daly's sculpture will dominate the exhibition although several paintings will also be displayed. Daly's latest sculptures include wood and iron objects which may reveal a mechanical or utilitarian past.

The Daly exhibition opens with a public preview and a reception for the artist at the museum at 8 p.m. It will run until May 16.

Daly began as a painter, but in recent years turned also to sculpture. He became professor of art in the College of Architecture in 1942. He formerly taught at Oberlin College.

Recipient of numerous awards, he had a one-man exhibition at the Rochester Memorial Art Gallery as winner of the gallery's 1963 Jurors' Show award. He has exhibited at one-man shows in New York City and has been represented in group and traveling exhibitions throughout the country. His work is in several permanent collections.
